Chairman's Message

Another year is coming to an end and a quick glance through the last twelve months shows that our village and its community have once again shone! February saw another successful Croston Music Fest which raised funds for Derian House.

In March and April Croston featured on both Channel 4 (Village of the year) and the BBC (Britain in Bloom) with both programmes showcasing the work of the many volunteers who work so hard in the village. June saw the arrival of the new floral display troughs on the river wall and another fabulous 'Music in the Woods event in aid of church funds.

In July the Open Gardens event saw visitors flocking to see the 19 gardens and raised much needed funds for Croston Together. The sun shone on Coffee Day and the river got a clean-up as residents joined Parish Councillors to remove years of rubbish from the river bed.

August began with a visit from the RHS Northwest in Bloom judges - it was Gold again - and some much needed rain fell to turn the parched grass to green again. Croston Village Festivities held a successful public meeting in September to gauge support for the Christmas Market and to appeal for volunteers so that the event could go ahead.

October saw the re-opening of Meadow Lane following the completion of works to replace the Railway Bridge. Sadly the new bridge has been a huge disappointment as the design is totally out of keeping with its surroundings. A campaign is now underway to have the design improved so that it blends in better with our village.

This year's Remembrance Day marked the centenary of the end of the First World War. The service at the War Memorial and Church was very well attended by both young and old. The work of Croston Knit-wits creating hundreds of poppies to mark the route of the procession was much appreciated.

We will have much to enjoy throughout December as the Christmas lights are switched at the close of the Christmas Tree Festival, to be followed by The Christmas Market.

The Parish Council thanks everyone who has helped in any way to make Croston the village it is and sends best wishes to all.

Town Bridge

The public consultation on the closure of Town Bridge found that there was a small majority in favour of keeping the bridge open.



A traffic survey was also conducted to investigate local concerns that the bridge was used as a 'rat run'. The survey showed that virtually all the traffic using the bridge was doing so to access local properties and there was no evidence of it being used as a through route or of the weight limit being ignored.

Consequently, LCC has concluded that there is insufficient community support to close the bridge to vehicular traffic and there is no compelling reason to do so; therefore closure will not be progressed at this stage.

Physically restricting the width was an option frequently mentioned in the comments from the public. The bridge is currently subject to a width restriction of 6'6" under a Traffic Regulation Order. The use of bollards would make legitimate vehicle manoeuvres difficult and could result in damage, and therefore this will not be progressed.

The volume of traffic shown to be using the bridge is unlikely to lead to any further movement of the structure. The County Council will continue to monitor the bridge and ensure it is appropriately maintained.

War Memorial

This year, to acknowledge the centenary of the end of the First World War, the Parish Council applied for a listing for the War Memorial.

Historic England approved the application and, on 6 September, the War Memorial was officially designated as a Grade II Listed Building, with a List Entry Number of 1458957.

The Memorial was unveiled on Saturday 30 October 1920 by Capt. Douglas H. Hacking, MP, latterly the Right Honourable Lord Hacking OBE (MP for Chorley 1918-1945).



A Bridge Too Far

A campaign to try to get Network Rail to alter the new Meadow Lane railway bridge to make it more in keeping with its setting is under way.

We were absolutely delighted to receive a GOLD award at the RHS Northwest in Bloom award ceremony in Southport on 1 November.


Congratulations also go to Andrew and Tracy of The Black Horse who also

Once necessary tree works are completed on the village green we will be creating a permanent garden for the Croston Charter.


We are working with the Parish Council to enhance the village car park on Out Lane. Subject to grant funding we are hoping to create a small orchard around the parking area and an edible hedge.

Help Us Help You this winter



Winter is a challenging time for the NHS, with more people feeling unwell with seasonal illnesses and a rise in the number of people admitted to hospital.

NHS and social care organisations across Chorley, South Ribble and Greater Preston are working together to prepare for this busy period, but there are things you can do to Help Us Help You stay well this winter.

Protect your health in the cold

- Have the free flu jab if you are over 65, have a long term condition or are pregnant. Children aged 2, 3 and those in up to year 5 in school can also have a free flu nasal spray.
- If you start to feel unwell, even if it's a cough or cold, don't wait until it gets worse. Seek advice from a pharmacist.
- Make sure you have stocked up on your repeat prescriptions or medication during weekends and over the bank holidays.
- Keep warm by heating your home to at least 18C (65F).
 Avoid visiting any loved ones who are in hospital if you are feeling unwell, particularly from suspected flu or the winter vomiting bug. Doing so will put your loved ones and other patients at risk.

Know which service to use

If you need urgent medical advice or treatment, call NHS 111 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The trained operators can offer advice on the correct service to use.

Visit your local pharmacy for advice on how best to treat minor ailments and injuries.

Remember, GP practices across Chorley, South Ribble and Greater Preston are working together to offer additional weekday evening and weekend appointments. Phone your surgery to book an appointment, or call 111 out of hours.

Urgent care centres are available 24/7 at Royal Preston Hospital and Chorley and South Ribble Hospital if you need urgent treatment but it is not a life-threatening emergency.

Be prepared for bad weather

- Keep an eye on severe weather warnings issued by the Met Office.
- Avoid slips trips and falls by wearing suitable footwear.
 Look in on vulnerable relatives and neighbours during periods of bad weather.
