Croston Parish Council and Chorley Council are holding a community skip day to allow residents to bring along unwanted household items for disposal.

Trade waste or hazardous materials/harmful items cannot be disposed of in the skip and will be turned away. These include TVs, computer monitors, asbestos, tyres, fluorescent tubes, fridges, paint and paint tins (unless empty), plasterboard, batteries, mattresses, medical waste, gas cylinders, liquids, solvents, oil, petrol, diesel and explosives.

Chorley Council will have an assistance service for some vulnerable residents - prior booking required, by Monday 4th July by calling Alan Platt on 01257 234003. Please note: Chorley Council Officers are not permitted to enter your property and can only collect items left outside.



# COFFEE DAY IS BACK SATURDAY 2ND JULY 2022

We are pleased to announce that Coffee Day is back.

The Village will be closed to all traffic between 11.30am to 2.30pm approximately

and barriers will be in place. We would ask that villagers who live on the route of the procession, if they would help on the day by moving their cars/vans etc. This will enable the procession to move through the village without causing any problems. We appreciate that this is not easy but would be grateful for your co-operation. Bishop Rawstorne car park maybe used. Please be aware that the prohibition of vehicles driving along these roads applies to all vehicles, including residents and people visiting businesses. Arrangements will be made for Emergency Vehicles.

The day will begin with a short service at St Michaels and All Angels Church at **11.30am**, followed by the Procession which will leave Church Street/Town Road at **12.00noon** and end at Croston Park at approximately **2.30pm**.

The Procession will proceed along Town Road and Station Road to the Railway Station returning along Station Road, Westhead Road to Riverside Crescent, where a short break will be held. During this time the children will be provided with refreshments. The procession will then return along Westhead Road and Town Road and end with bands playing to the residents of Croston Park.

There will be two decorated lorries for children under 6 years of age to ride on. These will be parked near the War Memorial form 11.00am. Please note children who have attended the Church Service will be given priority for seating on the wagon. For safety reasons children will only be allowed to get on and off the lorries when stationery. Parents are requested to contact a Lorry Steward before placing or removing a child from the lorry.

After the procession a number of events will be held in the Church grounds. In addition, refreshments which will include homemade cakes, tea & coffee will be available in the Old School. The fair is also back and a family picnic area in field on Westhead Road. The day will end with Grand Raffle draw at 3.30 pm approximately.

Council Tax rebate - criminals contact police and communities together residents requesting bank details to send a rebate to. Please note Chorley Council will automatically pay the rebate into resident's bank accounts.

Government Energy rebate - similar to the council tax rebate scam. Again bank details are requested.

Energy bills - callers purporting to be from OFGEM saying you can apply for your rebate and a discount on your autumn energy bills. The sole purpose of the call is to try to get bank account details.

Always remember, councils and genuine companies will **never** ask for your bank details over the phone.

Please do not interact with calls like this, hang up immediately and report the calls to your telephone provider Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or www.actionfraud.police.uk/
