Meadow Lane Railway Bridge

A meeting was held on 1 February 2019 attended by Seema Kennedy MP and representatives from Network Rail, Chorley Borough Council, Lancashire County Council, the Parish Council and the Local Action Group to discuss the upgrade of Meadow Lane bridge. During the meeting Network Rail apologised for not giving the local community prior notice of the work but confirmed it had met all planning procedure guidelines. The bridge is not a listed structure and is not in the

Conservation Area.

The foundations were found to be in poor condition and the use of a metallic parapet was due to this material being considerably lighter than a concrete or a brick equivalent, which would not affect the footings.

When asked whether the new



£2,646m structure could be rebuilt with piled footings and new foundations with stone parapets on top, Network Rail stated that, at a cost of an additional £3million it would not be financially or practicably feasible to do so as it would mean other bridges at safety-critical sites in Lancashire and Cumbria would be postponed for a further five years.

Network Rail has offered to work with the local community to improve the bridge's appearance by painting the inside of the metallic parapets either Holly Green, Battleship Grey or Pigeon Blue.

Plaque Dedication Service Sunday March 3rd, 2:00pm, **Trinity Methodist Church, Croston**

In 1939 Olga Bergmann Gabanyi, an 11 year old refugee, came to live in Croston. She left Prague on the 30 July on the Winton Kindertransport. Norman and Merci Cardwell opened their home to her and therefore saved her life. Norman Cardwell was, at that time, headteacher of Croston Wesleyan School, which Olga attended as well as Trinity Methodist Church. Olga went to live in the USA in 1947.

In honour of the Cardwells, and their mother Olga, the family are coming from the USA to this special event which many representatives from the Winton Kindertransport, local Synagogues, and Friends Meeting House as well as The Methodist Church, the churches congregation and local people who knew Olga and The Cardwells during the war years and beyond are attending.

If you are interested in this very special story and wish to attend this service you are most welcome. This will be a unique occasion which itself will become historical. It is now 80 years since the first Kindertransport left in December 1938, and 80 years since the first of Winton Kindertransports, which were solely for children. The last Winton Kindertransport left Prague on the 1 September 1939 never to arrive as war declared that day so say no more!
