Chairman's Message

The summer holidays are over, children are heading back to school and the Parish Council returns from its summer break on Wednesday 12 September. We have several projects which we hope to complete in the coming months including the re-surfacing of the village car park on Out Lane, works to the trees on the Village Green and further works to the Recreation Ground.



In late July Councillors Bruno Paillusson, Peter Fennemore and Kath Almond and I joined volunteers from Croston in Bloom and other residents to clear the River Yarrow of debris and overgrown

vegetation.
Starting at the Castle Walks Bridge and working along to the weir by the Old School, a mountain



of rubbish and greenery was removed which Chorley Council then took away.

The closure of Meadow Lane to allow the bridge over the railway to be replaced has

meant that the road through centre of the village has been very quiet. However Moor road and Bretherton have seen a big increase in traffic particularly HGV's. In recent years the Parish Council has joined with both Bretherton and Ulnes Walton Parish Councils to try to find a solution to the traffic congestion which plagues our villages but as yet attempts to get weight restrictions etc have been unsuccessful. We will continue to lobby for a solution!

for a short service. There will then be a Service at around 1:30pm at St Michaels and All Angels Church. Following the Service everyone is invited back to the Community Centre for refreshments.





Japanese Knotweed

We have a problem which needs to be addressed!

- knotweed is spreading within the village and needs to be controlled
- it has potential to cause very expensive damage to both public and private property and infrastructure
- it will take at least three or four years to eradicate by consistent herbicide applications and, where the growth has crossed property boundaries, the whole clump needs to be treated at the same time.

The first priority is to update the map of Knotweed locations in Croston. This needs to be done before the dieback makes it too difficult to identify the plants.

The second priority is the recruitment of a steering group. This should include skills such as:

- Secretarial, records, and communications
- financial management
- IT skills
- coordination, planning, programming, action table management
- horticultural and herbicide knowledge
- PR, liaison with other groups

Then there is the need to recruit volunteers to obtain

the cooperation of landowners hosting knotweed and to carry out the herbicide applications.



A Refresh for the Croft Field

As most people know, the Croft Field was set out 20 years ago as a mini country park for everybody to enjoy. At the time members of the community came together and planted trees, set out paths, created wildflower meadows and installed seating and a small play area. Managing the Croft Field balances public access and recreation with the landscape and wildlife, all within the historic context of the village.

The Croft Volunteers and the Church Council think it is time for the site to have a refresh. Some of the sculptures have come to the end of their serviceable lives, gateways are starting to look tired, the riverside path is poor in the winter and some of the play equipment needs replacing.

Croston Together were confident enough to provide the first grant, which was a great start. This money demonstrated local support and was used to unlock a much larger grant from the Lancashire Environmental Fund. This, in turn, demonstrated to the National Lottery Awards for All that the project had momentum and they offered a final grant towards the project

The most exciting part of the project is that stone will be used to refresh much of the play area. This will be in keeping with the area and be part of a long term maintenance solution. The new play equipment may take the form of an obelisk, a horizontal climbing wall, a stone climbing stack, scramble boulders carved into natural shapes or a circle of standing stones, final designs are being prepared.

We've had offers to sponsor carvings and there are opportunities to donate or sponsor other items of the project including play equipment, carvings, new gateway features and tree planting. If this is of interest please make contact with Tim on 01772 603339 or email croftfield@btinternet.com

The Croft Field is a unique resource for the whole village and there are very few other communities that have such wonderful site. The list of users grows and grows. As well as regular walkers, dog walkers, fishermen, children playing, residents of Croston Park and those travelling through to and from work the Croft is also used by visitors to the village who in turn help to keep the village vibrant. We also have regular forest school activity taking place on site.

The plan for the Church Council is to keep it that way so that as many people can enjoy the site as possible. Keep an eye open over the next 12 months, because some of the new sculptures may be keeping an eye on you!
